

Judge exempted for "700 people killed by vaccination" on male net

In July of this year, a man surnamed Li in Taichung City announced on Facebook that the number of deaths from vaccination had exceeded 700. He was sent to the police. In July this year, a man surnamed Li from Taichung City announced in the Facebook Public Association that "Taiwan's vaccine deaths have exceeded 700 deaths." Some netizens reported to the Ministry of Health and Welfare after discovering this. Li was sent to the Ministry of Health and Welfare after being found out by the police. However, the court heard Later, it was believed that according to the letter from the command center, as of August 2 this year, there were 548 suspected deaths due to vaccination. Although it did not match the number released by Li, there was "no huge difference," and the command center letter also stated "The summary is not clinically complete." It is obvious that the command center

did not know the exact number of deaths. It was determined that what Li said was not unreasonable, and Li was exempted from punishment.

The ruling pointed out that on July 24 this year, a man surnamed Li in Taichung City used his Facebook account in his residence in Xitun District to post an article in the public club "Double Bidden Monogatari of the Double Bid Party", mentioning that "Taiwan's death has been vaccinated." "Break through 700 cases". After seeing this, some netizens thought it was false and reported it to the Director's mailbox of the Ministry of Health and Welfare. The police notified Li to explain to the case, and found that Li violated the Law on the Maintenance of Social Order, and sent a letter to the Taichung District Court for the Taichung Summary Court Tribunal. .

During the brief court trial at the Taichung District Hospital, the man surnamed Li admitted that he posted a post on Facebook, but he argued that all vaccines generally take 7 to 10 years to develop, and there are some uncertain components in the vaccine that may be harmful. People are healthy. He believes that there are doubts about the use of the new crown pneumonia vaccine in the human body. In addition, some people who died of the new crown pneumonia vaccine were searched online, so they shared it on the Internet.

The judge believes that according to the letter from the Central Epidemic Command Center on August 12 this year, it only stated that as of August 2 this year, the number of "suspected" deaths after vaccination was 548, although the message with the man surnamed Li contained The death toll does not match, but there is no "huge difference" either.

The judge pointed out that the other letter also wrote "This summary is not clinically complete information, nor is it a clinical review. It is only a limited summary of information notified". Obviously, the center cannot fully understand and correctly indicate the actual number of deaths. It can be determined Li' s argument was that after searching for relevant information, he believed that the information is correct, before forwarding to the Internet, can not be found that Li is deliberately fabricating false rumors for dissemination, li exemption, can be counter-charged.
